Councilman Pete Rager made a motion with a second by Councilwoman Amanda Hudson to accept meeting minutes of the March 9, 2015 Reorganization meeting as presented. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

TREASURER’S REPORT/POLICE REPORT

Councilwoman Virginia Simpler read the Treasurer’s Report ending February 28, 2015.

Councilwoman Amanda Hudson made a motion with a second by Councilman Poncho Davila to accept the Treasurer’s Report as presented. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Police Officer Keith Darling reported that all background checks were completed. He also reported Justin Buchwald was selected to a 6 month period with no contract to work part-time seasonal. He is scheduled to start work effective April 1, 2015 if his schedule allows and council approval.

PLANNING COMMISSION REPORT:

Chairperson Mandy Slody reported the commission again had no quorum for the second meeting. She reported no new permits.

OLD BUSINESS:

Planning Commission Chairwoman Mandy Slody advised the council that the Comprehensive Plan draft needed to be submitted to PLUS. Councilman Poncho Davila made a motion with a second by Councilwoman Virginia Simpler to submit the Comprehensive Plan draft to PLUS for consideration. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Custer, owner of 7 Front St was given 5 days to board up the house that was recently involved in a fire by Code Enforcement.

BUDGET:

Mayor Chick Glanden and Councilwoman Virginia Simpler will meet two more times to finalize the draft budget to be submitted for Council approval.

Town Council Elections:

Mayor Glanden delegated duties to the new and existing members of the council- He asked Councilman Poncho Davila to assist Dustan Russum with the water department, Councilman Pete Rager to work on trying to get Frederica Road annexed into the Town and Councilwoman Amanda Hudson to take over the 911 addressing project.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY/CRIME WATCH:

Both need more community involvement.

OPEN FLOOR:

The question was raised concerning a sex offender living on Coleman Street. Officer Darling said he would check with the Sex Crime Unit because it is not technically his address and report back.

Councilman Pete Rager reported a problem with Well #4. An electrician was coming to repair a breaker the next day. He advised that Well #3 should be online with chlorine and fluoride March 19, 2015.

Councilman Rager reported repairs to the fence would be completed. Dustan made contact with the owner of the dumpster company and he thought the fence had been repaired but assured Dustan that he would take care of it immediately.

With no other business to discuss a motion was made by Councilwoman Virginia Simpler with a second from Councilman Poncho Davila to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote. Meeting adjourned at 8:05 PM
