



He has also swapped out some meters, met with Sen. Lawson and is working on the brown water problem on Jackson St with assistance from DRWA and office of drinking water.

Water's Edge resident Fred Staz asked how the electronic message board was constructed on the Water's Edge property. Councilmember Pete Rager and other councilmembers explained that Mr. Layton came to the council with the request. He then submitted the proper permits to the Council, Planning and Zoning, the State and Kent County and they ultimately were all approved. Council also scheduled a public hearing and advertised with the usual venues. At the Public hearing there was no opposition and the final permit was voted on and approved by Council. Mr. Staz was not happy that he was not personally notified.

With no other business to discuss a motion was made by Councilmember Pete Rager with a second by Councilmember Virginia Simpler to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote. Meeting adjourned at 7:45 PM.
