

**TOWN OF FREDERICA
ORDINANCE NO. 20-03**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 365 RELATING TO ON-STREET PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF FREDERICA IN COUNCIL MET:

That Chapter 365-34 of the Frederica Code be amended, in accordance with 19-06, by adding new sections to read as follows:

**ARTICLE IV
ON-STREET PARKING**

§365-34. On-street parking prohibited.

In addition to those prohibitions listed in Ordinance No. 19-06:

On-street parking is prohibited on the North side of the following:

- a. Channel Crossing
- b. Hightide Drive

On-street parking is prohibited on the East side of Jackson Street, beginning at St. Agnes Street and continuing south on Jackson Street, to the dead end.

On-street parking is prohibited on all streets/roadways in Waters Edge housing development two hours after snow fall, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Channel Crossing
- b. Hightide Drive
- c. Waterway Drive
- d. Tidewater Court
- e. Riptide Court

Repealer: All ordinances and part of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Effective Date: This ordinance shall become effective thirty days after adoption.

SYNOPSIS

This Ordinance amends Chapter 365 to prohibit on-street parking on the North side of Channel Crossing and Hightide Drive; to prohibit on-street parking on the East side of Jackson Street; and prohibits parking on any roadway/street in Waters Edge housing development two hours after snowfall.
