- A motion was made and carried unanimously to accept the minutes from the previous meeting in written form.
- Dustan Russum presented the Water, Code Enforcement, and Police Reports, notable points were as follows:

A meeting is scheduled in the second week of August to review the water main project on Jackson St. with Teal Construction.

No start date has been set has yet been set for the Central Market St. water main replacement project.

Flow testing is being undertaken to determine the supply available for the new proposed daycare on Central Market St., as well as the possible

Holy Cross High School.

Dustan resume again inquired with Dan from Penoni Engineering, about the options for replacement of the aging windows in Town Hall.

Jim Morris cut several properties with grass violations.

One property with code violations has been progressing on a schedule of work satisfactory to Dustan to withhold enforcement actions.

Dustan mentioned that Felton Police Chief Guilds was lining up a meeting with the Wyoming PD in interest of forwarding the accreditation process for our new officer Smith.

The green giant trees that were donated to the Town are scheduled to be planted by Burke tree service in the second week of August.

- A motion was made and carried unanimously to accept the Water, Code Enforcement, and Police Reports.

OPEN FLOOR

- Dawn Fletcher of 11 Thomas St. (*Who's house had recently been struck by a car*) complained about speeding traffic on Thomas St. She urged Council to consider installing speed bumps, and a 4 way stop sign at the intersection of Thomas and Hillside st.
- Christiana Johnston of 254 S. Market st. proposed a bike rack in the park, as well as the installation of flashing speed limit signs.

NEW BUSINESS

- The Council moved unanimously to facilitate the pass-through CTF funding for the Frederica Senior Center to repave their parking lot, contingent on the fact that it would not incur more than \$1000.00 of expense to the town itself by doing so.

OLD BUSINESS

- There were no new Police General Orders.
- There was no further progress on the Comprehensive plan to act upon.
- Before close, Councilwoman Shaw suggested that an additional security camera be added to face the new vending machine in the town park. Megan McIlvain also commented that she liked the newly added stop signs.
- At 7:33 pm, Council moved unanimously to adjourn the meeting.
